

White collar swapped for feng shui harmony

Now that Jenna Boyd has balanced her life, she has set out to help others get things under control. The former corporate executive recently threw in the white collar to start her own company, the Elements of Harmony, devoted to bringing the principals of feng shui to Atlantans.

Boyd describes the feng shui system as one that "purposefully arranges your environment into harmony and balance. Once we feel balanced at work or home, there's a positive energy created that stays with us. It's a really personal thing."

Her first classes on the topic are coming up at the Chastain Arts Center, 135 W. Wieuca Road. Beginning on Wednesday, and running for three weeks, the two-hour sessions will teach students how to apply the feng shui principals to their own homes and offices.

After learning the basics, students will be sent home to make changes that they'll talk about at the next class. They'll also bring in home or office floor plans that Boyd will help transform. "I keep the numbers to 10 or fewer in a class so I can work with them one-on-one," she said.

You can get a look at Boyd's handiwork by dropping by the center, which she recently treated to a feng shui makeover as part of a community service project.
